The ACSA program has been revised to provide candidates greater flexibility and is now focused on individual job functions.

Certification Track

ACSA: Apple Certified System Administrator (ACSA) certification verifies an in-depth knowledge of Apple technical architecture and an ability to install and configure machines; architect and maintain networks; enable, customise, tune and troubleshoot a wide range of services; and integrate Mac OS X, Mac OS X Server, and other Apple technologies within a multi-platform networked environment. The ACSA certification is intended for full-time professional system administrators and engineers who manage medium-to-large networks of systems in complex multiplatform deployments.

ACSA certification has just become easier and more flexible....

The ACSA program has been revised to provide candidates greater flexibility and is now focused on individual job functions. All ACSA exams are elective, so candidates are free to structure the program to meet their needs.

Each passed exam earns a specialisation certificate and a specific number of credits toward ACSA certification.

All exams are based on Mac OS X Server v10.5.

NOTE: Due to the considerable number of changes and new features from Mac OS X v10.4 Tiger to v10.5 Leopard, there are no update exams for Tiger to Leopard certifications.

Registration

Exams are administered by Prometric, a worldwide provider of comprehensive technology-based testing and assessment services, at testing centres worldwide. Candidates are required to have an Apple Tech ID number before registering for an exam. You can apply for a Tech ID by following the instructions at certifications.apple.com.
